Dear Lord Chalfont-

I understand from Francis Pym that your recent mission to Morocco was a great success. I should like you to know how grateful we were that you agreed to give up your valuable time to undertake this delicate and important task. We were extremely fortunate in having available at the right time someone with such good contacts in Morocco and with such ready access to the King.

Your visit has helped improve the atmosphere of Anglo/Moroccan relations and to prepare the way for the possible reinstatement of the Arab League visit. You know the problems we face on the PLO issue and we have no illusions as to the difficulties the matter poses for the Arab side, but we will shortly be putting to King Hassan compromise proposals on which we hope he will be able to secure the agreement of his colleagues, and which will allow the visit to go ahead. We have stressed throughout that we attach great importance to our relations with Morocco. I hope very much that we can agree on a suitable programme.

Thank you again for your valuable contribution to this important exercise.
