I have seen a copy of the minute which the Secretary of State for Wales sent to the Prime Minister on 9 September about the transfer of rating responsibility for Wales from the Secretary of State for the Environment to the Secretary of State for Wales.

- 2. As Miss Bowdery said in her minute of 12 August, there is no objection to the proposal in machinery of government terms.
- 3. I fear that this is a matter on which Welsh (as well as Walkerian) amour propre is at issue: rating is the only aspect of local government finance in Wales for which the Secretary of State for Wales is not responsible, and the Secretary of State for the Environment is prepared to relinquish it.
- 4. The important consideration seems to me to be that separate responsibilities should not lead to differences in the operation of the rating system, or at least not to differences for which Ministers collectively have not accepted as reasonable and sensible. I suggest that the Prime Minister might accept the proposal, subject to satisfactory arrangements to secure that objective. I offer the draft attached.
