TORONTO SUMMIT: THEMATIC PAPER

I have not yet had the chance to go through the draft the Canadians have just sent over. Meanwhile, however, I had taken the opportunity after our return from Toronto to check with the Chancellor the formulation he would like to see for a 'structural reform' passage for the U.K. He has suggested the attached improved version of the draft we worked out together, and I hope you will be able to feed this in (for any communique draft, if not for the thematic paper) - previous experience suggests that countries are allowed to draft and amend their own passages!
