FORMULA RATING REVIEWS

Thank you for your letter of 2 August on this matter, together with your detailed proposals for cumulo values for the formula-rated industries. I have also seen the letter of 9 August from the Prime Minister's Private Secretary.

At an earlier stage, Nicholas Ridley and I were agreed that the proper approach in this matter was to seek to achieve valuations which were based, so far as possible, on a methodology consistent with rating valuation principles. we know, formula rating is not a wholly satisfactory method of deriving rateable values. I nevertheless consider that your proposals, based on our agreed approach, do achieve a good measure of equity as between conventionally-assessed and formula-rated industries; the asset values approach is analogous to the well-established "contractor's principle" of valuation; whereas the recourse, in one or two instances, to turnover (although, I appreciate, inevitable) does take us quite far away from proper rating principles. Further, I would see fundamental objections to any suggested alternative based upon rolling forward 1973 List Valuations by some average figure - this would do no more than maintain existing unfairness in the distribution of tax burdens, whereas the 1990 revaluation as a whole is intended to redistribute those burdens more fairly.

It follows from what I have said that I agree both with the detail of your proposals and with your suggestion to move these industries into conventional assessment for 1995. I await with interest your proposals for division of these industry valuations as between England and Wales for the 1990 List.

I am copying this letter to the Prime Minister, Nicholas Ridley, Malcolm Rifkind, Norman Lamont, Cecil Parkinson, John MacGregor, and to Sir Robin Butler.
