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PERSONAL COMMUNITY CHARGE: EXEMPTION FOR THE SEVERELY MENTALLY IMPAIRED

Thank you for your letter of 26 September.

I agree with you that a difference in treatment of people whose mental impairment arises from a degenerative condition or disease cannot be justified. Your proposal seems to me to overcome the difficulties which have so far prevented us from including this group of people, by removing the need for GPs to come to a judgement on the point at which the condition has deteriorated to the point at which exemption is warranted.

I note that the exemption could increase the number of people exempt from the community charge by over 150,000. This could add £1 or more to the average annual community charge for people who are not exempt; but I am satisfied that this would be justified by the removal of an indefensible inequity. I recognise the concern of DSS that there may be some extra cost caused by an increase in applications for the proposed new filter benefits; but, as you say, the current exemption also relies on filter benefits, and it is encouraging that no difficulties seem to have arisen in Scotland.

I therefore support your proposals, and if colleagues are content I would intend to make similar regulations in England. In view of the increasing controversy on this point I should like to make an announcement in my speech on Wednesday; and I should therefore be grateful if colleagues could indicate whether they are content as quickly as possible. I enclose a copy of what I hope to say.


