PRIME MINISTER'S MEETING WITH SIGNOR ANDREOTTI

Signor Vattani, the Italian Prime Minister's diplomatic adviser, has been in touch to arrange a meeting between Signor Andreotti and the Prime Minister before the European Council in Rome at the end of October. After a certain amount of negotiation, we have settled on a meeting at Chequers on Saturday 20 October. The Prime Minister wishes to keep it very small and in principle the Italians have agreed that only Vattani will accompany Andreotti, together with an interpreter.

I should be grateful if the department could deal with the detailed arrangements. The Italians intend to arrive at about 1245. I have suggested that they come into Northolt and helicopter down to Chequers for lunch at 1315, with talks continuing after lunch for as long as necessary.
