Rine Amorton MR POWELL I went across to see Black Rod this morning about arrangements for President Cossiga's address on Wednesday. The address will take place in the Royal Gallery. Black Rod suggests that the Prime Minister should make her way to the Royal Gallery from her room, rather than via the Norman Porch steps, which will be crowded with the Italian suite and members of the Press: the Detectives are happy with this suggestion. I attach the order of play, together with a copy which I have annotated with various extra stage directions. The Prime Minister will wait a little to the right, at the top of the Norman Porch staircase with the Lord Privy Seal and the Lord President, for the President's arrival. The Lord Great Chamberlain will introduce the Prime Minister, the Lord Privy Seal and the Lord President at the top of the stairs, and will then escort the President to the robing room. At this point the Italian suite and the Prime Minister, the LPS and the LPC will make their way to their seats in the Royal Gallery. The Prime Minister's seat will be on the front row on the right hand side, as you look at the dias. It will be the second seat in from the aisle - the Lord President will have the end seat. Events then follow the printed programme. The Prime Minister stays in position until the President moves off down the aisle towards the Princes Chamber, escorted by the Lord Great Chamberlain. The Prime Minister can then make a quick getaway down the Norman Porch staircase so that she arrives back at No. 10 to greet President Cossiga for the lunch.
