The new Yugoslav government will be sworn into office on 15/16 May. Mr Pym considers that it would be in accordance with normal courtesies and would furthermore mark our concern to develop our relations with the Yugoslavs if the Prime Minister were to send a message of congratulation. I enclose a draft. If the Prime Minister agrees, we shall instruct the Ambassador in Belgrade to offer the message along with one from Mr Pym and probably others from the Secretaries of State for Defence and Trade.
