STOCKTAKING REVIEW OF THE HEALTH SERVICE IN SCOTLAND

The Prime Minister has seen your Secretary of State's letter of 3 October to the Secretary of State for Health, in which he sets out his proposal to publish a booklet on the Health Service in Scotland later this week.

The Prime Minister is concerned about the proposed timing of this publication. She considers that publication should be held back until the NHS review discussions are further advanced.

PROPOSED SCOTTISH PUBLICATION ON THE HEALTH SERVICE

Malcolm Rifkind's letter of 3 October attached proposes the publication later this week of a stocktaking review of the Health Service in Scotland.

The draft is mostly backward looking, but there are some forward looking passages, e.g., at Flag A. In any event, it strikes me as very odd at this point in time - perhaps particularly in the light of this afternoon's NHS discussion - for one of the Health Departments to publish any such document.

Would you prefer that the Scottish Office should hold this back at least until we are clear on the NHS review?
