HEALTH AND MEDICINES BILL: A COMMERCIAL APPROACH TO NHS PROPERTY file with PG.

I cannot say that I welcome Kenneth Clarke's proposal, set out in his letter to you of 10 October, to enable health authorities to engage in joint property development ventures as an enhanced incentive to the disposal of surplus NHS land. I have been trying to get the public sector - including local authorities - out of property development, at which it is not very good. But if nonetheless colleagues want to go ahead I think that the power must be circumscribed in at least two ways.

First, the power to acquire further land to facilitate such development must be limited if health authorities are not to start accumulating land unnecessarily - they still have some 4,000 acres of unused and underused land on my land registers.

Secondly, to be consistent with my proposals for controlling local authority companies, it will be essential that the activities of NHS joint ventures are brought within an appropriate capital control system.

These proposals - particularly for leasehold disposals - also need to be considered alongside the recommendations of an inter-departmental working group on surplus land disposals, whose report will be coming to Ministers shortly. A more pro-active approach to the management of disposals carries the risk of increased conflict with government planning policies for sensitive areas. The working group will be proposing guidance, which should enable cases of potential conflict to be identified and brought to Ministers' attention before any action is taken that might lead to public controversy.

I am sending a copy of this letter to the Prime Minister, Kenneth Clarke, other members of H Committee and Sir Robin Butler.
