INCREASES IN MONETARY LIMITS ON LOTTERIES UNDER THE LOTTERIES AND AMUSEMENTS ACT 1976

Thank you for copying to me your letter of 7 November to John Wakeham on this subject.

As you know I had previously indicated my support in principle to a raising of the Great Britain lottery limits. Having now seen the details of your proposals you may take it that I have no objection to any aspect of these from a Northern Ireland standpoint.

I should mention that the Northern Ireland law, which has been in operation for little over a year, allows only one type of society's lottery and no society may hold more than one lottery in any period of 7 days. Here there is a limit of £80,000 on the turnover of any one lottery and £1 million on the total turnover of all lotteries run by any society in a year. No prize can exceed 10 per cent of the proceeds, ie £8,000. As in Great Britain, the maximum price of a ticket or chance is 50p.
