You will recall that Sir Roy Griffiths had sent in before yesterday's meeting a rather pained minute. He was deliberately not invited to the meeting, because his presence would have further complicated a difficult set of issues. I think he does need to be kept reasonably sweet - the last thing we want is for him publicly to disassociate himself from the Government's decisions when they are announced. So I think that at some point you ought to see him. options are: to see him after Easter before the next internal meeting; to leave seeing him until after the next meeting.
