

### PRIME MINISTER

### MEETING WITH THE EDG

On Wednesday you are seeing the Conservative members of the European Parliament at 5.00. Also attending will be the Foreign Secretary, the Chairman and the Chief Whip. This meeting has already received considerable attention in the press and I understand that there is great interest in it.

I have discussed with Christopher Prout how the meeting should be handled. He will be letting me have a detailed note for you on Monday, but his preliminary thoughts are that the agenda should be as follows:

Theren 1. E number 2. The single market - what further initiatives are required to make 1992 a reality.

Co-ordination between the EDG and

- a) The other parties in the Parliament progress on the EDG's application to join the Christian

  Democrats
- b) Westminster MPs
- c) Central Office and the Party
- d) The Government
- 3. The Inter-Governmental Conference and EMU this is obviously the area where we are most likely to differ. Our MEPs all wish to see an increase in the powers of the Parliament; Christopher is keen to stress that this does not mean a transfer of power from Westminster to the Community, but rather a shift in the balance of power between the Community's institutions.

I am not sure that this will wash, but Christopher hopes that the meeting will agree to the setting up of a mechanism for dialogue between the Government and the EDG to discuss this question.

4. <u>Eastern Europe</u> - Christopher would like to end on a less contentious subject and believes that the EDG would like to hear your views on recent developments, and in particular the prospect of re-unification, the proposed European Development Bank and business opportunities in Eastern Europe.



I believe the Chairman will also be giving press interviews.

There will be about 40 people present at the meeting and I would suggest using the Pillared Room. The EDG are also keen to be photographed with you and this could be done before we get down to the substance. Edward Llewellyn of the Research Department has asked if he could sit in; since he deals with the EDG daily and is our principle source of intelligence, I think this would be useful. Christopher has also asked if he may bring the Secretary-General of the EDG who is actually a Dane, but a great supporter of yours.
