POINTS TO MAKE

NEW YORK TALKS WENT WELL

1. We and Argentines now have a clearer understanding of each other's positions. Islander participation helpful.

IN OUR INTEREST TO MAKE PROGRESS

2. Political and commercial advantages: good relations with Argentina; secure Islanders' future; unlock resources of South West Atlantic.

ISLANDERS ENDORSEMENT INDISPENSABLE

3. No solution possible otherwise. In their interests, too.

LEASEBACK THE BEST OPTION

4. Other options dangerous and expensive.

RESOURCES CAN'T BE EXPLOITED WITHOUT ARGENTINES

- 5. Need their cooperation to:
 - (i) declare 200 mile fishing zone to gain licensing revenue
 - (ii) explore for and exploit any oil: only drilling can show whether any there.

SCVEREIGNTY HAS TO BE DISCUSSED

6. We reject Argentine claim. But practical <u>modus vivendi</u> required. Impossible if we don't talk about sovereignty. No fisk in this: any solution subject to agreement by Islanders and Parliament.

NO IMPLICATIONS FOR GIBRALTAR AT THIS STAGE (IF RAISED)

7. Once Lisbon Agreement implemented (removal of restrictions in return for agreement to "negotiate") ready to talk with Spain about anything. Need to monitor possible inter-relationship of two questions carefully.
