Our Chamber is therefore most seriously 3 concerned because that long history of friendship is now at 5 stake to the detriment of the many individuals and companies of British origin or affiliation present in Argentina putting at 7 risk a relationship developed over more than a century which may be destroyed in one day but would require decades to repair. This concern extends also to what we believe is a lack of awareness in the United Kingdom with respect to the sincerity and 10 11 intensity of the feelings of the Argentine people towards the 12 issue under discussion ever since it arose 150 years ago and their 13 frustration after seventeen years of fruitless talks. 14 The Chamber is anxious that a neaceful settlement to this problem 15 be reached. The highest sense of mutual respect and consideration 16 must prevail.
