AMBASSADOR WOULD HAVE GATHERED IN DUBLIN. HE THOUGHT THE ONLY WAY OF SHIFTING IT WOULD BE FOR THE PRIME MINISTER TO TELEPHONE HAUGHEY PERSONALLY BEFORE THE FOREIGN MINISTERS'MEETING IN LUXEMBOURG ENVISAGED FOR 16 OR 17 MAY.
