## 290. Information Memorandum From the Director of the Bureau of Politico-Military Affairs (Howe) to the Under Secretary of State for Political Affairs (Eagleburger)<sup>1</sup>

Washington, May 24, 1982

**SUBJECT** 

Limpet Mines

We have looked at the question of whether transfer of Limpet mines to the UK could be traced back to us if the British used them in their Falklands operations.

Our current information indicates that Limpet mines manufactured by the U.S. have *not* been transferred to any other country. Several countries including the UK, however, make similar devices.

This suggests that (1) disabling or sinking a ship with a Limpettype device would not point the finger at the U.S., but (2) if a U.S.manufactured Limpet mine was recovered intact and examined by experts, it probably could be traced back to us.<sup>2</sup>
