THE QUEEN'S VISIT TO BELIZE

Mr Nott has seen John Holmes's letter of 15th October and your reply of 18th October. He agrees with the Prime Minister and the Foreign Secretary that the visit would pose an unacceptable risk of causing The Queen serious embarrassment.

There are two specific implications for our Defence policy which underline that conclusion. First of all, since independence the British garrison has been stationed in Belize solely for the purpose of external defence. If the garrison were to be used for policing and internal security duties during The Queen's visit it would not merely be setting a precedent it would also be a wholly anomalous task for British forces in an independent country. We believe, however, that this is a task the garrison would have to undertake if the visit went ahead since it would be unwise to rely upon the Belize authorities to provide adequate security themselves. We would of course need the permission of the Belize government to assist in providing security for The Queen. There is perhaps a risk, albeit very small, that Mr Price might refuse our help. In this instance we would be put in the embarrassing position of having our forces stand idly by whilst there was a potential (or possibly an actual) threat to Her Majesty.

A royal visit in February would almost certainly delay our withdrawal and reduce our planning flexibility. Although there is a possibility that it might dampen tensions with Guatemala, it seems more likely to increase them and consequently increase the risk of our forces becoming embroiled in conflict.

Mr Nott was also asked to consider the possibility of delaying an announcement of withdrawal until May 1983.

From a military viewpoint, it would be desirable to have four months public notice of withdrawal. The consequence of any delay in the announcement would be to set the process back into August or September which sees the onset of the rainy season in Belize with the prospect of hurricanes. In practical terms we would almost certainly therefore face a withdrawal towards the end of the year and this would be contrary to the stated intention of the recent OD meeting to achieve withdrawal of the garrison by June 1983.

Mr Nott will be happy to discuss the matter with the Prime Minister and Foreign Secretary on the 2nd of November.

The Prime Minister has noted the contents of your letter of 21 October, which will be before Ministers when they discuss on 2 November the question of the Queen's visit to Belize.



Belize: Royal Visit

Mr Pym has seen your letter of 21 October. He is glad to see that Mr Nott shares his views on the risk involved in the proposed visit and looks forward to discussing this further at the meeting on 2 November.

Mr Pym was, however, a little surprised by the reference in your letter to the OD decision on the withdrawal of the garrison. While the minutes of the OD meeting of 8 September record a desire on the part of members that the garrison should be withdrawn by June 1983, they also record that the Committee's decision was only that the garrison should be withdrawn in the course of 1983. Mr Pym believes that, given the complexities of the situation, it would at this stage be unwise to fix on a final date, and undesirable to put in hand any plans that would signal the possibility of an early withdrawal to the Guatemalans.
