Visit of Indian Minister of External Affairs

The Indian Minister of External Affairs, Mr Narasimha Rao, has accepted an invitation to visit the UK as a guest of Government to attend the ceremony on 2 November at which HM The Queen will unveil a statue of Earl Mountbatten of Burma. Mr Rao will attend the subsequent reception in the Banqueting House and the luncheon at Buckingham Palace.

A detailed programme has not yet been arranged. But we expect Mr Rao to arrive in London on 1 November and to leave late on 3 November or on 4 November. Sir Geoffrey Howe will hold official talks with him and host a lunch in his honour on 3 November.

Mr Rao has been Foreign Minister since January 1980 and called on the Prime Minister during his last official visit to the UK in November 1981. Since then, our relations with India have continued to improve, as evidenced most recently by the £250 million contract awarded to Westlands and British Aerospace to supply Sea King helicopters and Sea Eagle missiles. We have also been seeking a closer political dialogue with the Indian Government. It would therefore seem appropriate for Mr Rao to call on the Prime Minister during his forthcoming visit. The timing would be particularly opportune, some three weeks before the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting in Delhi.

I should be grateful to know whether a call of say 30 minutes by Mr Rao on the Prime Minister would be possible. I understand that the Prime Minister might be free at 9 am on 2 November before the unveiling ceremony. Other alternatives would be the afternoon of either 2 November or 3 November.
