Falkland Islands Fisheries: Sinking of a Taiwanese Fishing Vessel

The reports that have appeared so far in the media about this incident are substanually correct. The Taiwanese fishing vessel ignored a challenge from the Argentines, and made a dash for it. The Argentine coast guard boat chased, fired and sank the Taiwanese boat. At least one Taiwanese was killed. The incident occurred less than 200 miles from the Falklands but more than 200 miles from the Argentine coast, by our definition on the high seas. According to radio reports, the Argentines are seeking to justify their action on the grounds of their claim to sovereignty over the Falkland Islands.

I attach copies of two telegrams to posts abroad giving the facts and the text of an on the record statement which News Department made at the regular 12.30 news conference today.

Lady Young will, with the Secretary of State on his return, be giving urgent consideration to the policy implications of this incident for us.

I am sending copies of this letter to John Howe, Martin Dinham, Ivor Llewelyn and Richard Broadbent.

The vessel, Chiann Der 3, was 22 first intercepted some 15 miles outside the FIPZ (48'46S 59'56W) and shot at at a point about 5 miles outside the 23 24 FIPZ. Derbes. The vessel was shot at at 1915Z after refusing to proceed to Argentina, and the crew abandoned ship at 2050Z. Two other Taiwanese vessels escaped into the FIPZ. The vessel attacked sent a garbled and emotional message on a 4-metre band claiming it was under machine gun fire and on fire. This was picked up by a Falkland Islander on the Camp radio network. The vessel requested assistance from the British Navy:

c) response: a Hercules C130 was sent to investigate, and HMS Brilliant also proceeded to the edge of the FIPZ. Two Sea King helicopters and a further Hercules were scrambled at 2135Z on reports of urgent assistance needed for men in the water. By 2330Z the Argentine coastguard vessel had recovered 21 survivors and 1 dead crew-member. No crew members were missing. British forces offered medical help, but the Argentines said the three Taiwanese casualties were not seriously injured and they were proceeding at full speed to Puerto Deseado.



South West Atlantic fishery semi colon and has urged all the countries concerned, including Argentina, to support it.

Yesterday's incident illustrates all too vividly the validity of this view. Earlier this week the British Government reminded the Argentine Government, through the Swiss Government, of the need to avoid actions in the South West Atlantic that could increase tension.

In answer to questions: Did the incident occur in British waters? By virtue of our sovereignty over the Falkland Islands HMG has a right to claim fisheries jurisdiction over adjacent waters. As far as HMG and international law are concerned the waters in question remain the high seas, more than 200 miles from Argentina. What are the implications for British sovereignty? Argentine action has no implications for British sovereignty over the Islands nor for our right to claim fisheries jurisdiction. Will you now claim fisheries jurisdiction? HMG reserves our position entirely on this matter.
