Dear Mr. Kinnock,

You need to be asked one question. Do you agree with people being murdered and maimed for political purposes? You must know it is the policy of the ANC to kill people and this is why it receives arms and ammunition from the Soviet Union and the eastern block. If you support them you must agree with their policy.

There is little I can say about this puerile behaviour (whereby you are reported to have said in the House of Commons that I am a fascist, and Inkatha is a fascist movement). I treat your alleged utterances and mock fascist salute with the contempt they deserve.

You need to be told that there are millions of black South Africans who desire decency and democracy in this country, and they are sick and tired of being intimidated by the ANC and UDF.
