Vear Prince Phinister.

Thank you for your letter of 31 July setting out your Government's position on sanctions against South Africa.

Let me first say that I share Swaziland's rejection of apartheid, and your wish to see an end to it. I also agree with you that general economic sanctions would not solve the problem. Like you, the British Government believe that dialogue is the only effective means to bring about the changes we all want to see in South Africa.

We too are keenly aware of the dependence of your economy on South Africa. Indeed the vulnerability of South Africa's neighbours to sanctions and counter-sanctions has been a major consideration in our opposition to comprehensive sanctions. You may rest assured that we shall continue to bear it in mind; and I applaud your initiative in bringing home your concerns to the other participants in the Commonwealth Review Meeting.

## Letter to the Prime Minister from the Prime Minister of Swaziland

Mark Addison wrote on 27 August enclosing a letter to the Prime Minister from the Swazi Prime Minister.

Prince Bhekimpi wrote in identical terms to the Commonwealth Secretary-General before the Review Meeting in August, explaining Swaziland's opposition to sanctions. Copies of his message were circulated to Heads of Government attending the meeting. We now understand that he has also issued the message separately as a letter to each of the participants.

In conveying the outcome of the Review Meeting to the Swazi Government, the High Commissioner at Mbabane was instructed to confirm that we should be studying and would continue to bear in mind Prince Bhekimpi's message to the Commonwealth Secretary-General. The Prime Minster's reply, therefore, need only be brief. I enclose a draft.
