Mr Crabbie reports that Beregovoy: "beamed and adjusted his after dinner speech (a major event in his calendar) to include a warm reference to it. It caused a minor sensation in the hall, since it was the first news the audience had had of it. In particular Beregovoy mentioned the outgoing Chancellor's espousal of the hard ecu,

which he described as worthy of further consideration and 'not in the slightest bit absurd!'. It is a point he had made in a slightly lower key the previous day at another gathering."

Beregovoy is, we understand, writing formal letter congratulation to the Prime Minister.

The Chancellor thinks it would be a nice touch if he were able to tell Beregovoy at this weekend's informal ECOFIN that Prime Minister was aware of his kind reference at the French Bankers' dinner, was touched by what he said, and was most grateful for his congratulations.
