PEACOCK REPORT

The Prime Minister has seen the draft Statement about the Peacock Report attached to your letter to me of 30 June.

The Prime Minister shares the Chancellor's concern about the half sentence at the foot of page 3 which states that the Government does not share the apparent view of the Peacock Committee that there is nothing in the nature of the broadcast medium itself to require special regulatory arrangements.

The Prime Minister suggests that the phrase beginning "but the Government" could be amended to read:

"but the Government are quite clear that any future system of controls must be no weaker than the present system."
