Thank you for your letter of 21 October concerning ITN representations against possible plans by the BBC to start a world television news service.

I regret that I had not previously been aware of this correspondence. I find that David Nicholas, Editor, ITN, wrote to the Chairman of the Party, in that capacity on 29 September. Mr Tebbit then wrote from Conservative Central Office to Sir Geoffrey Howe on 14 October, and he acknowledged the letter from Mr Nicholas. Also, his office wrote to Stephen Sherbourne on 14 October, enclosing a copy of Mr Nicholas' letter and asking that it might be drawn to the Prime Ministers' attention.
