MEETING OF MISC 128

Tomorrow's meeting is the first of two on additional programme services. The idea is to start tomorrow with a presentation by the DTI (probably led by Mr. McDonald). You might then want to have some initial discussion, but to leave substantive discussion and decisions until the second meeting on 25 April.

Key papers are:-

- Flag A the very helpful brief by Mr. Langdon dated 31 March, which you have already seen. This guides you through the issues.
- Flag B a supplementary brief covering the points raised in an exchange of letters between Lord Young (Flag C) and Mr. Hurd (Flag D).
- Flag E a note by Brian Griffiths distilling the key points and issues.
- Flag F a further note by Brian reporting on a meeting with
 Lord Young earlier this evening at which a major new
 technical factor emerged namely that it may be
 possible to make adjustments within the existing span
 of the UHF spectrum. If there is anything in this it
 is a major new development which will have to be
 considered either tomorrow or at the 25 April
 meeting.

The formal papers for the meeting are in the two dividers. You may like to look at the summary paper 5, but I doubt if you need plough through the more detailed paper 4 by officials.
