As you will know, the Prime Minister saw Paul Reichmann some weeks ago and subsequently visited Canary Wharf with him on 11 May. On both occasions Reichmann urged the Prime Minister to visit some of his developments in Toronto. The Prime Minister was non-committal, referring to her busy programme there.

Reichmann has written repeating the proposal. I enclose a copy of his letter. I suggest that we keep the possibility in mind but make no arrangements for the time being. If against expectations there is a spare hour in Toronto, then we might take up the suggestion at the last minute.
