CONRAD BLACK'S DINNER:
7 for 8 p.m., Tuesday 21 June 1988

The Prime Minister will be received at the entrance to the Toronto Club by Mr. Conrad Black and Mr. Charles Cowan, Vice President and Secretary of Argus, at 7:30 p.m.

2. The Governor General proposes to arrive at 7:40 p.m., and the guests will be invited to move in to dinner at 8. It is expected that the Prime Minister will be escorted in to dinner at about 8:10.

3. At dinner the Prime Minister will be sitting on Mr. Black's right, and to her right will be Mr. Maurice Sauve, husband of the Governor General. The Governor General will be on Mr. Black's left. The other guests on the high table will be Mr. Mulroney, Mr. Peterson, Premier of Ontario, Chief Justice Brian Dickson of the Supreme Court of Canada, the Lieutenant Governor of Ontario, Cardinal Carter, John Turner, Leader of the Federal Liberal Party, Dr. Henry Kissinger, and James Baker, U.S. Secretary of the Treasury.

4. At the beginning of dinner grace will be said by His Eminence Cardinal Carter. At the end of dinner Mr. Black will speak first to welcome and introduce the Prime Minister, and after the Prime Minister has spoken, Dr. Kissinger will make a speech of thanks.




