**PRIME MINISTER'S VISIT TO OTTAWA: 22 JUNE 1988: PROPOSED CHANGE IN ARRIVAL TIME**

1. The Canadians have at this late stage noticed that rather too much time has been allowed between the arrival of the Prime Minister's aircraft at Ottawa and her address to the Joint Session of Parliament. What they now propose is that the arrival at Uplands airport, Ottawa, be delayed by 10 minutes. The consequential changes in the programme for the Prime Minister's visit to Parliament Hill would be as follows:

- 1010 (instead of 1000) : Arrival at Uplands airport Ottawa
- 1030 (instead of 1020) : Depart Uplands airport accompanied by Mr Mulroney
- 1050 (instead of 1040) : Arrive Parliament Hill
- 1100 : Address to Joint Session of Parliament

2. The detailed programme for the visit to Parliament Hill will require some revision, provided that the Canadian request can be met, and we shall be re-submitting a revised detailed programme.

3. I should be grateful for your agreement in principle to this change: it will of course also allow a delay in departure time of 10 minutes from the hotel.

Purpose

Prime Minister Thatcher will attend a Special Convocation of the Benchers of the Law Society of Upper Canada to be elected an Honorary Bencher of the Society.

Site

Osgoode Hall lies on the north side of Queen Street between University Avenue on the west and Nathan Phillips Square on the east. Ownership of the building and grounds is divided. Approximately one half belongs to The Law Society of Upper Canada and the other half to the Province of Ontario. It houses The Law Society of Upper Canada, which is the governing body of the legal profession of Ontario, and the Judges, Courts and some administrative offices of the Supreme Court of Ontario.

The building faces south and is separated from Queen Street by a driveway which crosses from east to west immediately in front of it and by a wide treed lawn enclosed by an ornamental iron fence. On the east the building abuts Nathan Phillips Square and on the north abuts a pedestrian walkway which separates it from the Metropolitan Court House. On the west it is separated from University Avenue by a wide lawn and low fence.

Procedure

16:30 Benchers, their spouses or consorts will come to the south front of Osgoode Hall and enter it through the Benchers' Entrance.

Those who require transportation directly to the Benchers' Entrance will enter the grounds by car through the west gate off University Avenue. The gate will be open and guarded.

The Chief Justice of Ontario and the Chief Justice of the High Court and their wives will be guests of the Benchers on this occasion. They will enter the Hall through the tunnel under the Court House.

17:00 The Benchers, their spouses or consorts will assemble in the Benchers' Reception Room on the second floor. The Benchers will be gowned. Their robing rooms are on the ground floor.

17:20 The Benchers, their spouses or consorts will go from the Reception Room directly to the Great Library, entering the Library through the south east door.

The Benchers will be seated on a dais at the east end of the Library. Their spouses or consorts and other guests will be seated in the body of the Library.

The judges and their spouses or consorts who are guests will enter the Great Library by the main doors from the Government portion of the Hall and be seated in the body of the Library.





17:30 Mrs. Thatcher will enter the grounds through the west gate. Her car will stop in front of the Benchers' Entrance.

She will be met by the Treasurer and the Secretary, come in through the Benchers' Entrance and proceed up the stairway and via the north Benchers' hallway directly to the Great Library, entering it through the southeast door.

17:35 Convocation will proceed (see Attachment No. 4)

17:45 At the conclusion of Convocation, Mrs. Thatcher and the Treasurer will return to the Benchers' Reception Room and stand within. The Benchers and others will enter the Reception Room and be introduced to Mrs. Thatcher as they do so.

Refreshments will be served in the Reception Room and on the Benchers' Landing. Convocation Room will be open.

18:00 Mrs. Thatcher will leave through the Benchers' Entrance where her car will be. She will be driven out through the west gate onto University Avenue.

18:30 The Benchers, their spouses, consorts and guests will go to the Benchers' Dining Room for dinner.

Security arrangements require that when dinner is over the Benchers and their spouses or consorts leave by the Benchers' Entrance.

## PROCEEDINGS AT CONVOCATION

June 18, 1988

The Treasurer, Mrs Laura Legge, will call Convocation to order and will say:

"Madam Prime Minister, I welcome you to Osgoode Hall and to this Convocation, called for the purpose of electing you an Honorary Bencher of the Law Society of Upper Canada.

We are aware, Prime Minister, that you were called to the Bar in Lincoln's Inn in 1954 and were made an Honorary Bencher in 1975. The Society's connections with your Inn go back to its earliest times, though our history is short by European standards. In June of 1792 three Englishmen arrived by bateau at Kingston at the eastern end of Lake Ontario; they would shape the face of both the land and the law of the new country, one was Colonel John Graves Simcoe, a Devon man, who became the first Lieutenant Governor of the new province of Upper Canada; John White of the Inner Temple who became the first Attorney General and the first Treasurer of this Society; and William Osgoode of Lincoln's Inn who became the first Chief Justice of Upper Canada after whom this Hall was named.

When it was built by The Law Society in 1829 the Hall was surrounded by open fields and the little Town of York lay some distance to the south and east. The earliest part of the building, which included the Benchers' Entrance through which you entered a few moments ago, was opened in 1832. A dozen years later the central and western wings were added to provide this Library, a row of Chambers and Court Rooms for the Court of Queen's Bench and the Court of Chancery. The Society continued to own the entire structure until 1885 when the western part in which the Courts are housed was ceded to the Crown. The ownership of Osgoode Hall continues to this day to be shared between The Law Society and the Government of Ontario.

There have been twelve Honorary Benchers of the Society of whom two are alive, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth, the Queen Mother and the Right Honourable Roland Michener a former Governor General of Canada and a practising member of the Bar of Ontario.

We welcome this commemoration of our ties with Lincoln's Inn and with the Bar of England which supplied the seeds from which the legal profession here has grown.
