## CABINET: PUBLIC EXPENDITURE

The attached Cabinet Office brief, together with the Chief Secretary's paper, cover all the main points. (The Chief Secretary's paper incorporates comments I fed in over the weekend.)

## Three other points:

(1) Given the plan for the Chancellor to make his oral statement and release various printed documents in the afternoon, it would be very helpful for the Treasury if the discussion could be completed early in the Cabinet meeting. At the moment the Agenda has this as Item 5. I suggest you bring it forward - perhaps immediately after Parliamentary and Home Affairs.

Top-up loans for students can be left as Item 6.
