PUBLIC EXPENDITURE SURVEY 1989

I note from your letter of 25 May to the Chief Secretary that you intend to have a meeting with Peter Walker and me to discuss your PES 89 proposals. I welcome this opportunity and look forward to hearing further from you about the proposed meeting.

I note that you expect to be able to maintain the momentum on existing programmes and to introduce TECs within existing baseline provision. I am aware that will not be easy. In Scotland and other parts of the country away from the prosperous South East the improvement in the employment situation has been slower and started from a lower base. There is a long way to go yet and there remains a risk that the present gradual improvements in the employment situation could be slowed or halted. I therefore share your view that this is not the time for further major reductions. What is needed now is a period of stability while we establish TECs and Scottish Enterprise.

I am copying this letter to the Prime Minister, the Chief Secretary and the Secretary of State for Wales.
