Public Attitudes to Europe

I understand that you have asked where matters now stand on the proposals made in the Foreign and Commonwealth Secretary's minute of 20th June to the Prime Minister for a campaign to increase public support for the Community.

2. As instructed by the Prime Minister (your letter of 27th June to George Walden), the question of a concerted Government campaign on Europe will be reviewed once there is a clearer indication of whether and when there is likely to be a satisfactory outcome to negotiations on a revised Common Fisheries Policy. Meanwhile officials are preparing a report on the progress that has been or might be made in the Community on practical matters of direct value to the citizen. OD(E) is expected to consider both questions early in the New Year.

3. I am sending a copy of this minute to George Walden.
