You very rarely use personal minutes, and it might be better to do this in the form of a letter from Clive; a statement to Parliament about completion of the review and the scale of the proposals - either by you, or by the Lord President and Minister of State; a target date of the end of March for decisions on 4. the recommendations within each Department; publication of the report to Parliament and the public, together with a detailed recommendation of the decisions reached, in due course - preferably with the same timing as the proposed White Paper on efficiency and waste; CSD Ministers, assisted by John Boreham to oversee implementation; new instructions from you to Robert Armstrong about the 7. role of the Head of the Government Statistical Service - again this is drafted as a personal minute from you but can easily go in the form of a minute from Clive on your behalf. /The
