1. Exchange of Americans Held by Angola for Soviets
Held by UNITA. The exchange of two alleged American
mercenaries held by Angola for two Soviets held by Savimbi's
UNITA again appears to be on track. The proposed exchange
was first floated by the Soviets with Zaire in June 1981.
The U.S. has played a role in trying to expedite communication
on the issue, but we have avoided intervening directly with
the Soviets. UNITA leader Jonas Savimbi has now indicated
to us that he is prepared to cooperate in expediting arrangements. The Angolans are being pressed by the Soviets to
cooperate in the exchange. An exact date for the exchange
has not yet been fixed, but it could occur as early as the
end of January, probably on Zairian territory. (S)

Italy and the Soviet Gas Pipeline. Italian Prime Minister Spadolini announced publicly at year's end that his coalition government had decided on a "pause for reflection" regarding Italy's role in the Siberian pipeline project. "pause" apparently refers to Italy's negotiations for the purchase of Soviet natural gas, not to contracts for building the pipeline itself. The decision stems mainly from partisan political maneuvering (the coalition's Socialists want to embarrass Italy's Communist Party by taking a tougher line on Poland). Important political and economic interests still favor the project, however, and Italy will be careful not to get too far ahead of its European partners on sanctions. Even so, Italy's decision to review its role may indicate that the project is not yet an accomplished fact. We are studying ways we might use this opportunity to delay or stop the pipeline project. (C)
