Mrs Renée Short That this House, while wholeheartedly condemning the invasion of the Falkland Islands by Argentina, calls upon the Government to seek as a matter of urgency a peaceful settlement through the United Nations under the terms of the Security Council Resolution 502 which calls on the Governments of Argentina and the United Kingdom to refrain from the use or threat of force in the region of the Falkland Islands and: (1) demands an immediate cessation of hostilities, (2) demands an immediate withdrawal of all Argentinian forces from the Falkland Islands, Islas Malvinas and (3) calls on the Governments of Argentina and the United Kingdom to seek a diplomatic solution to their differences and to respect fully the purposes and principles of the Charter of the United Nations in the belief that this is the only way to safeguard the interests of the Falkland Islanders, to prevent a futile loss of life and to avoid the drift to world war in which we would all be the losers and hence urgently seek time for peaceful negotiations.
