

1. News: This reflected primarily the Government White Paper and news from House of Commons. Also included were UN attempts to finding a peaceful solution, the helicopter crash in Chile and an unconfirmed report of a Harrier attack on the Falklands. In addition mention was made of N Zealand and Australian support offered to UK and lastly on Economics there was a feature on the Argentinian Economy. All news was collated from available public sources and the sources quoted. Throughout the evening the main news feature was the House of Commons Debate on the White Paper, which was also included as a special feature.

## 2. Separate Items:

- a. Detention of Falklands VIPs: A feature was done on the detention of prominent Falkland residents based on reports from Daily Mail and Times.
- b. "The Military Situation". This is a regular feature of the programme and dealt with the effectiveness of Harriers. It was based entirely on comment obtained from reputable Latin American Press sources, including the Chilean magazine Ercilla.
- 3. <u>Popular Features:</u> A comprehensive programme of popular music was included throughout the programme which included Argentinian examples of folklow type music.
- 4. Sentimental Interlude: Mariana Flores our resident Lady announcer dedicated a number of songs and poems to soldiers on the Falklands. Mention was also made to separated families. \* Sentimental Interlude is a permanent feature of the Stations programmes.
