

Summary of Programme No 5 - 23 May 82

## 1. NEWS

This was a relatively quiet day while our Task Force consolidated their position. However various air attacks were reported and running totals of aircraft destroyed also given. A further report was quoted based on Max Hastings account of the first official encounter of a Royal Marine with a family of Islanders. This took the form of a dialogue between two announcers. A further report of political options open to both sides was also discussed from a set script concluding in the suggestion that surrender was the only way out of their predicament. Again close and direct pressure was kept on our audience in an attempt to highlight their miserable situation.

- 2. <u>Separate Items</u>. Political and military quotes were taken from the press releases of statements by Mr Nott, Adm Sir Terence Lewin and Lt Col Donkin. This continued with a report on the condition and state of Argentinian prisoners. The size and power of our Task Force was highlighted.
- 3. Popular Features. Once again a mixed programme of popular and folklore type South American music was played.
- 4. <u>Sentimental Interlude</u>. "Running childhood reminisences" was our main feature which concluded with accentuating the traditional ties that should hold Argentina and UK together. The usual dedications from Mariana of poems and music were made to Argentinian soldiers serving in Fort Stanley.
- 5. Reception. No jamming was reported.
