SBS hero killed by British bullet

The SBS men met up in thick mist with a patrol from the advancing British forces who opened fire before the commandos could identify themselves.

Shouts in English stopped the brief hall of bullets but by then Sergeant Hunt lay fatally wounded.

The incident highlights the biggest danger the daring special forces face in their undercover role that has them unexpectedly appearing on the wrong side of the lines.

Sergeant Hunt I Wed in quarters in Walchern Place at the SBS depot in Poole, Dorset. A memorial service for him was held at the base yesterday attended by the Iew SBS men still in Britain.

It was conducted by the padre, the Rev Peter Jackson. Both the Press and public were banned.

The PR Line is: "Our information was that Sgt Hunt was killed in action. We have had no further information since".
