YOUR TELNO 1322: FUTURE OF HONG KONG: SUGNATURE OF THE AGREEMENT.

1. HE CALLED ON ZHOU NAN TODAY AND SPOKE AS HANSTRUCTED HAN PARAGRAPH 4 OF TUR. IN SAND THAT YOU WOULD ACCOMPANY THE PRIME MINISTER. ON THAMING OF THE VISIOT, IN ADDED WHEN MAKING POINT (B) OF PARAGRAPH 4 THAT THE PRIME MINISTER WOULD NOT TAKE A FINAL DECUSION UNTIL THE BEGINNING OF NOVEMBER.

- 2. ZHOU SAND THAT HE WOULD CONVEY WHAT IN HAD SAND TO HIS LEADERS. THE FACT THAT THE PRIME MININGSTER HAD DECIDED PERSONALLY TO SHIGH THE AGREEMENT SHOWED THE GREAT HIMPORTANCE WHICH THE BRINTINSH GOVERNMENT ATTACHED TO THE HONG KONG QUESTINON. NOT WAS VERY GOOD NEWS AND, ZHOU SAND, WOULD BE GREATLY WELCOMED BY THE CHINESE GOVERNMENT. ZHOU THEN ASKED THREE QUESTINONS:
- (A) WOULD THE PRIME MINNISTER WISH TO DISCUSS BILLATERAL RELATIONS AND MULTILATERAL QUESTIONS OF COMMON CONCERN WITH CHINESE LEADERS THE ADDITION TO SHIGHING THE AGREEMENT?
- (B) WOULD SHE WANT TO TRAVEL TO OTHER PARTS OF CHINA?
- (C) HOW LONG DOD SHE WHISH TO STAY HAN CHIMA?
- 3. IN SAND THAT, SPEAKING PERSONALLY, IN BELIEVED THAT THE PRIME MEINWESTER WOULD WISH TO HOLD DISCUSSIONS WITH CHINESE LEADERS ON BULATERAL RELATIONS AND ON MULTIPLATERAL QUESTIONS OF COMMON CONCERN. IN DIED NOT KNOW WHETHER SHE WOULD WISH TO TRAVEL TO OTHER PARTS OF CHUNA. SHE HAD OF COURSE PAND TWO EARLINER VINSHTS, DURING WHICH SHE HAD HAD AN OPPORTUNITY TO SEE SOMETHING OF THE COUNTRY. SHE WOULD BE GLAD TO KNOW ABOUT ANY CONSIDERATIONS OF THIMMING WHICH THE CHINESE GOVERNMENT, AND IN PARTICULAR ZHAO ZHYANG, MIGHT WANT TO PUT TO HER.
- 4. ON THEMEING ZHOU SAIND THAT HE WOULD LET ME KNOW THE PREFERENCES OF ZHAO. HE ASKED WHETHER THE PRIME MINNESTER'S VINSINT WOULD BE COMBINED WITH VIESINTS TO SOUTH EAST ASHIAN COUNTRIES WHICH HAD EARLIER BEEN POSTPONED. IN SAND THAT THUS WAS NOT YET DECEMBED.

- 5. ZHOU ASKED WHEN PARLSHAMENT WOULD BE HAN SESSION AND WHEN THE AGREEMENT MINGHT BE DEBATED. TO SAND THAT IN THOUGHT PARLSHAMENT WOULD BE HAN SESSION FROM ABOUT 22 OCTOBER TO ABOUT 14 DECEMBER. TO THE BEST OF MY KNOWLEDGE, NO DATES HAD YET BEEN FRIZED FOR THE DEBATES HAN THE TWO HOUSES.
- 6. WE CONCLUDED WHITH A BREMEF DUSCUSSION OF THE RECEPTION SO FAR GRIVEN TO THE AGREEMENT. ZHOU SAND THAT THE CHANESE GOVERNMENT WAS GRATHFUED THAT SECTIONS AROUND THE WORLD INCLUDING THE REACTIONS OF PEOPLE IN ALL WALKS OF LINFE IN HONG KONG, HAD BEEN FAVOURABLE.
