PRIME MENISTER'S PRESS CONFERENCE IN WASHINGTON 21 FEBRUARY: NEW ZEALAND

1. REPLYING TO A QUESTION ABOUT NON-FULFILMENT BY CERTAIN ALLIES
OF THEIR MILITARY COMMITMENTS, THE PRIME MINISTER SAID SHE WAS
VERY DISAPPOINTED BY THE APPROACH TAKEN BY THE NEW ZEALAND PRIME
MINISTER WITH REGARD TO SHIP VISITS. HIS GOVERNMENT WERE WELL AWARE
OF THE BRITISH POSITION WHICH WAS THAT ALL BRITISH NAVAL VESSELS
WERE SECONDED TO NATO AND MIGHT AT ANY MOMENT HAVE TO ASSUME NATO
POSITIONS. THEY MUST THEREFORE CARRY WHATEVER ARMAMENTS WERE
APPROPRIATE TO THEIR NATO TASKS. SHE HAD NO INTENTION WHATSOEVER
OF REVEALING WHETHER PARTICULAR WEAPONS WERE ON A PARTICULAR
VESSEL AT ANY GIVEN TIME. THE PRIME MINISTER SAID SHE WOULD BE
VERY DISAPPOINTED IF ROYAL NAVAL SHIPS COULD NOT VISIT NEW ZEALAND.
THE NEW ZEALAND PEOPLE WERE VERY CLOSE TO THE PEOPLE OF GREAT
BRITAIN, AND SHE THOUGHT THAT THEY WOULD BE DISAPPOINTED TOO. SHE
WAS VERY WORRIED ABOUT THIS PROBLEM.
