I also understand that John Gummer gave a firm undertaking to them that you would be able to do this.

When an approach came direct from the Foreign Office to Number Ten, the request was declined because we did not know about this earlier undertaking, and because of diary difficulties. Mr MacLay is only in London from 19th-23rd September; you will be in the Middle East from 16th-21st September and back in the office on the 23rd.

I spoke to Jim Spicer about this matter, who told me about John Gummer's promise. He feels very strongly that because there has been a slight misunderstanding our end, it would be helpful to good relations if you were to agree to see Mr MacLay if at all possible. Although Monday, 23rd is your first "working" day after you get back from Egypt, Caroline does have a slot at 10.45 a.m.

Would you agree to see Mr MacLay then?
