f canada, Madame Sauve, has Dear Charles The Governor-General of Canada, Madame Sauve, has requested a brief personal call on the Prime Minister when she is in London later this month. Madame Sauve has met the Prime Minister on several occasions, notably during Mrs Thatcher's visit to Ottawa in 1983, when Madame Sauve was Speaker in the Canadian House of Commons. Their acquaintance dates from the early 1970s, when the Prime Minister and Madame Sauve were respectively Minister of Education and Minister of State for Science and Technology. You will recall that the Prime Minister was unable to see Madame Sauve when she came to London in June 1984 to see The Queen (your letter of 31 May 1984 to Peter Ricketts refers). I hope that the Prime Minister will be able to see her on this occasion. Madame Sauve will be in London from 22-28 November, primarily to call on The Queen on 26 November and to address the UK-Canada Chamber of Commerce on 27 November. Her programme is fairly open at the moment, and a call could therefore be scheduled to suit the Prime Minister's convenience.
