Dear Mr Turnbull,

The Energy Committee is about to begin an enquiry into the energy policy implications of the greenhouse effect. Members are aware of the strong interest of the Prime Minister in this subject.

The Committee has therefore asked me to write to you to say that we would be delighted if the Prime Minister were able to give evidence to us in this enquiry. If she wished to do so, we would, of course, meet at a date and time which is convenient for her.

At present we have provisionally arranged for representatives of Her Majesty's Government to appear on the morning of Wednesday, 1 March. This would be our first oral session. We would also anticipate taking oral evidence from the government at the end of the enquiry.
