SAVING THE OZONE LAYER CONFERENCE, 5-7 MARCH 1989
INVITATION TO PRESIDENT MOI

The High Commission in Nairobi have sounded out President Moi informally about speaking at the opening ceremony of the Ozone Layer Conference on Sunday 5 March. His office have said he is keen to come. The next step is for the Prime Minister to send a formal invitation: I attach a draft.

If the Prime Minister is content it would be helpful if you could send the signed letter to FCO for onward transmission.

We would like participation in the conference to be announced simultaneously in London and Nairobi, on Thursday 26 January, the day Mrs Chalker will be meeting Moi in Nairobi. They will send the text of the letter to Nairobi in advance to clear the way for this. Our press office will be in touch about the announcement, which might also give details of the Prime Minister's own involvement in the conference (mentioned in your letter of 12 January). These two elements, together with the Prince of Wales' attendance of the heads of delegation dinner will be a powerful attraction to overseas governments.
