I am writing to confirm the arrangements we discussed for the seminar on climate change which the Prime Minister is to chair.

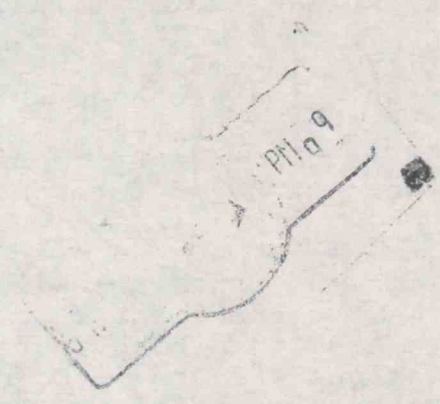
You told me that the Prime Minister was free on Monday, 24 April and we are content to go firm on that date, if the Prime Minister agrees.

£55,000 opera boost from wonderfuel gas

BRITISH Gas has announced the £55,000 sponsorship of a new opera about ecology and conservation.

Called *A Small Green Space*, with libretto by novelist Fay Weldon and music by Ilona Sekacz, the piece is being produced by English National Opera's outreach unit.

Thanks to the sponsorship, the opera will go on a national tour starting in Basildon in April and ending at The Place in London in June as part of the 1989 London International Opera Festival.
