PRIME MINISTER

On Sunday you are to attend the formal opening of the "Saving the Ozone Conference" at the Queen Elizabeth II Centre at Westminster. A detailed programme is attached at annex A.

You will need to be ready to leave Downing Street about 9.40 am so as to arrive at the QEII at 9.45 am where Nicholas Ridley will be waiting to greet you and to introduce Dr Tolba, the Executive Director of UNEP. President Moi will arrive five minutes later. Nicholas Ridley and Sir John Johnson, our High Commissioner in Nairobi, will accompany you onto the steps in front of the Centre to meet President Moi. Inside the foyer you will want to introduce him to Lord Caithness Lord Glenarthur, Mrs Bottomley, Dr Tolba, Sir Terry Heiser (Permanent Secretary, DOE) and David Burr (Deputy Secretary, Environmental Protection, DOE). The media will be present.

After the introductions everyone will proceed to the Churchill Auditorium for the Opening Ceremony at 10.00 am . You, President Moi, Nicholas Ridley, Lord Caithness and Dr Tolba will be escorted to the platform. Nicholas Ridley will make a brief introduction and will then invite you to say a few words of welcome. President Moi will follow with his keynote address. Nicholas Ridley will offer a vote of thanks. The media will be present.

There will be a coffee break at 10.30 am upstairs in the Benjamin Britten Room where you will have an opportunity to meet delegates informally. The Conference' own photographers are likely to be present taking informal pictures of the delegates.

The first working session of the Conference begins at 10.55 am. You have said you would like to sit in on the first three speakers leaving after Joe Farman has spoken, to view the industry exhibition. President Moi is likely to wish to visit the exhibition with you. Virginia Bottomley will accompany you.

As you enter the exhibition the DOE stand will be facing you.

ODA's stand will be to the right and Chris Patten would be pleased to show you round their stand. This will explain the ODA's vital role in helping to develop and maintain the Third World's tropical forest resources, the work of their scientific unit and that of the Overseas Development Natural Resources Institute. It is likely President Moi will be interested in the aid-funded reafforestation project in the Embu district of Kenya. Other displays will be provided by ICI, RTZ, DuPont, Atochem (France),

Foam and aerosol manufacturers, Sainsbury's UNEP, the UK Stratospheric Ozone Review Group and UK Remote Sensing. The media will be present. President Moi is likely to leave about 12.00 noon. You will probably wish to depart shortly after bidding him farewell. In the evening, at 6.30 pm, there is a reception for delegates in the Durbar Court at the Foreign Office which you are co-hosting with Nicholas Ridley. Mr Thatcher is also attending. The media will be present to photograph you receiving the delegates. Conference photographers will be present throughout the Reception to take informal photographs of the delegates.
