Monis. GLOBAL CLIMATE CHANGE: SEMINAR AT DOWNING STREET Many thanks for your letter of 23 March. I am honoured to have been invited to the seminar and am much looking forward to it. You referred to the scope of my short review. In fact I was not planning to say very much about the Montreal Protocol except as a useful precedent for international action, albeit on a relatively narrow issue. Unless you suggest otherwise I was proposing to speak on broadly the following lines: the role of governments and public opinion in raising awareness of the implications of global climate change establishing the basis for international action a brief look at what has already been done through the WMO, UNEP, the ICSU and the World Climate Programme international debate through the Brundtland Commission, the UN General Assembly and the rising tempo of international seminars and conferences work of the current Inter-governmental Panel on Climate Change the institutional problem of how to handle international action -/ UNEP and the Inter-governmental Panel - how to give a major high level impulse (adapting old institutions and coping with demands for new ones such as from the French and The Hague conference participants) /- international



- international agreements, conventions or protocols, and what might go into them
- the politics of international action, with particular reference to non-industrial countries
 - how they contribute to changes in atmospheric chemistry
 - what they should be persuaded to do about it
- scope for any British initiatives

For a talk which I shall limit to between 15 to 20 minutes, I shall not resort to visual aids. I plan to draw on notes rather than use a text.
