Dear Prime Minister, I write to you
on behalf of Raoul Wallenberg - a
swede captured in Budapest 1945 by
the invading Russians - and whose dis-
appearance has never been explained -
apart from the fact he was declared as
dead 1947 in the Lonthanka prison -
No actual proof or documents have been
produced to his family in Sweden. Raoul
Wallenberg was at the time of his arrest
personally responsible for rescue operation
of the jewry in Hungary - as a personal
envoy to the World Refugee Board, World
Jewish Congress and indirectly President
Roosevelt - and was an instrument in
saving 100,000 lives. The Swedish Foreign
Office has been singularly unsuccessful
in obtaining news of Mr. Wallenberg -
Not until his plight was brought to

the attention of Norris McWhirter
- incidentally his Ross McWhirter Memorial
Foundation awarded Wallenberg a £.1000
prize for services to humanity 1980 - has
this tragedy got all the interest it
deserves and a demand for his release
has again been voiced - I would, Prime
Minister, be most beholden if you could
see a way to bring Wallenberg's name
with you to Washington - President
Reagan's attitude towards the Russian
totalitarian system seems to be as
unafraid as your own.
