SOUTH GEORGIA

A satellite telephone call was received from the Captain of HMS ENDURANCE at 1530. ACNS(0) and DNOT spoke to him between 1530 and 1545. The local times in South Georgia are four hours earlier (ie 1720, 1730, 1745).

He reported that the Captain of the BAHIA PARAISO has informed the BAS Commander that the Falkland Islands had surrended . The BAS Commander unconditionally and that he should do the same. declined and the Captain of the BAHIA PARAISO intimated that he was considering sending Marines ashore. The BAS Commander replied that this would be a provocative act, and he would prefer to discuss the situation with a representative of the BAHTA PARAISO if one could come ashore. The Captain of the BAHIA PARAISO said that his helicopter would bring a representative ashore.

The Captain of HMS ENDURANCE has advised the Royal Marines detached in GRYTVIKEN not to fire on the helicopter. However in accordance with current ROE it was made clear that the Royal Marines should resist a takeover of the base by force until it became pointless.

ACNS(0) agreed his proposed movements as follows. to conceal himself in one of the many fjiords in South Georgia where he would be less liable to detection than on the open sea. He intends He would be less vulnerable to attack by surface ships. to defend himself by all means including the use of anti-ship missiles from his helicopters.
