1. I UNDERSTAND THAT THE BBC HAVE BEEN IN TOUCH DIRECT WITH NO 10 ABOUT POSSIBILITY THAT THE PRIME MINISTER MIGHT GIVE THE BBC/GULBENKIAN FOUNDATION LECTURE FOR 1984 DURING HER VISIT.

2. THE PORTUGUESE WOULD I AM SURE, BE GRATIFIED SHOULD THE PRIME MINISTER DECIDE TO GIVE A LECTURE WHILE SHE IS IN LISBON.

THIS COULD BE ON ANY GENERAL THEME, SUCH AS THE POLE OF EUROPE IN THE MODERN WORLD. AS SEEN FROM HERE, IT WOULD NOT BE NECESSARY TO SPEAK FOR MORE THAT 25 MINUTES, OR TO ANSWER QUESTIONS AFTERWARDS.
